Keyword	Definition	Definition

Forest	A large area covered with trees.	+ What the atmosphere is like- sunny, hot, dry, rainy, cold, cloudy
Mountain	A large, steep hill.	A large town. Handler A built up area that is bigger than a city. Handler than a city.
Sea	A smaller area of water that is found where the land and water meet.	A group of houses and buildings smaller than a town. + +



Oceans are large areas of salt water joined to each other but they are separated into five major sections. Oceans cover around 70% of the Earth's surface.




The Pacific Ocean is the largest ocean.






