

Grindon Infant School Nursery Literacy Medium Term Planning 2023-2024 Autumn 2- You Choose Area of Learning **Focus** • Enjoy songs and rhymes, tuning in and paying attention. Literacy • Join in with songs and rhymes, copying sounds, rhythms, tunes and tempo. • Say some of the words in songs and rhymes. [SEP] COMPREHENSION • Sing songs and say rhymes independently, for example, singing whilst playing. • Enjoy sharing books with an adult. SEP • Have favourite books and seek them out, to share with an adult, with another child, or to look at alone. • Repeat words and phrases from familiar stories. [SEP] • Ask questions about the book. [SEP] • Make comments and shares their own stideas. [SEP] • Develop play around favourite stories using sprops. [SEP] • Pay attention and respond to the pictures or the words SEP! Literacy • Notice some print, such as the first letter of their name, a bus or door number, or a familiar logo. **WORD READING** Phase 1 **PHONICS** • Provide many opportunities for children to develop familiarity with stories, nursery rhymes, poems and songs. • Provide opportunities for planned talk. [SEP] • Plan opportunities for closed and open questions. • Plan opportunities for role-play. [SEP] • Plan opportunities to enhance the children's vocabulary. • Plan 'building sentences orally' activities. [SEP] • Plan opportunities to make up stories together [SEP] • Plan opportunities for children to talk about the things that they have made. [5] Phase 1 is divided into seven aspects. It is intended that each of the first six aspects should be dipped into, rather than going through them in any order, with a balance of activities. Aspect 7 will come later in the year, when children have had plenty of opportunity to develop their sound discrimination skills. Each aspect contains three strands: Tuning in to Sounds, Listening and Remembering Sounds and Talking About Sounds. Aspect 1-General Sound Discrimination-Environmental Sounds Aspect 2-General Sound Discrimination-Instrumental Sounds Aspect 3-General Sound Discrimination-Body Percussion Aspect 4-Rhythm and Rhyme SEP Aspect 5-Alliteration SEP Aspect 6-Voice Sounds • Develop listening and speaking skills in a range of contexts. Literacy • Copy finger movements and other gestures [SEP] WRITING
